#### Fossils – No Bones About It! Offered Oct. 4, 2011 – Feb. 2, 2012

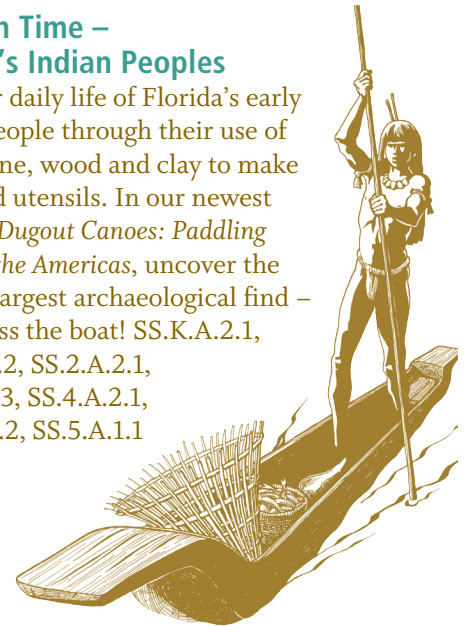
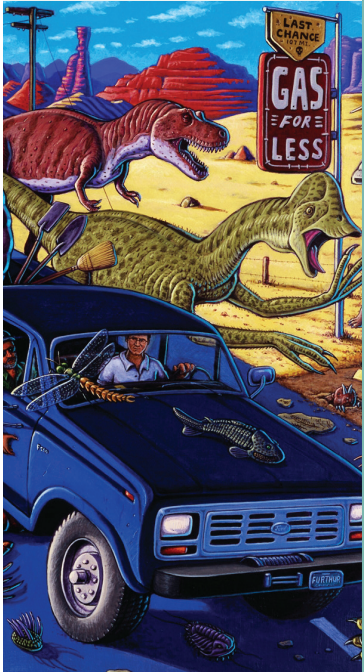
