

COAL AGE TREE STUMPS IN INDIANA

Abstract published in Indiana Academy of Science Proceedings, Vol. 81, p. 190, 1972.

During the spring of 1971 the Paleobotany class of Indiana University located three casts of Sigillarian trunks apparently standing in place where the trees once grew. These were found exposed in the No. 5 pit at the Hawthorne strip mine of Peabody Coal Company. Several more trunks were located during the summer and one was collected by the Indiana State Natural History Museum before mining was stopped in the area. The nature of the trunks, positions, size and relationships were discussed and a photographic record of them was used to illustrate the talk.
